We have some new equipment for our classroom! I recently posted a donation request for a data projector for our classroom and, through the generosity of family members and two parents of Coloma Elementary students (Brenda Crisenbery and Mindy Watson!), it was funded. We are now the proud owners of an Epson data projector, and boy, have we been using it this week! We've used it during writing time for the write-together and in social studies to show pictures of things we're

talking about. We were able to look up a mining company while we were talking about the history of mining in this state.

We also have a set of "clickers" loaned to us. With the clickers, I can ask a question and everyone enters the answer with their clicker. Then, we can see the percentage of kids who got the right answer. That way, instead of only one child getting called on to answer a question, everyone is expected to answer every question! We've practiced using the clickers on a few

tests, but for now, we're sticking to pencil-paper tests. That way, students won't get lower scores just because they didn't use the clicker correctly, and you'll still get your child's paper in the Friday Folder.

Next, I paid for a subscription to **spelling-city.com.** You can access this website from home! If your child logs in, you can see their spelling tests online and how they are doing on their spelling assignments (They have three assignments to complete in class each

Last, the school has purchased a subscription to Moby Math (runmoby.com). Your child can log in at home and work on this website during the school year and breaks. If you feel your child needs to "catch up" or you want them to get a head start on 4th grade, this would be a great resource! The kids take a placement test

(everyone has done this), and based on the results, they are assigned lessons. It hits those areas your child struggles in or just hasn't learned yet.

With only a few exceptions, I have had to discuss behavior expectations with the whole class. I know the kids are excited about Spring Break, but they need to remember basic rules. 1. Don't interrupt when someone is talking. 2. Raise your hand to be called on instead of blurting out. 3. Stay on topic. 4. Save conversations

with friends for recess or nonwork times. If you could help reinforce these, I would appreciate it.
