This Week in Class

In math, we practiced filling in number grids, finding differences, and working with place value to quickly add or subtract multiples of 10 and 100.

In reading, we focused on identifying the author's purpose of texts. The students were excited to see that the newspaper contains all three purposes for writing: to persuade, to inform, and to entertain. In writing, students practiced explaining the author's purpose of stories we read this week. They also practiced using Microsoft Word 10 and saving and retrieving work from the network (big steps!).

In science, we concluded from the results of our experiment that most plants do not absorb water through their stems and leaves. The mums that received water to their roots looked much healthier than the mum that were watered on their leaves and stems. We also performed an experiment on celery and learned that water travels up tubes through the stem and into the leaves.

In social studies, the students continued tracking the CSL Assiniboine as it traveled through the Great Lakes and arrived at Burns Harbor. They participated in a videoconference sharing what they learned with another school in Michigan.




Spelling Test
