## Safe in a Tornado

Since a tornado can happen almost anywhere, it is a good idea to know how to be safe if a tornado strikes. The table gives some safety tips.

### In School

Follow teacher's instructions.

Go to a safe place without many windows.

Cover your head with your hands.

### At Home

Go to the basement, into a closet, under stairs, or under large furniture. Have a flashlight, battery radio, candles, matches, and water handy. Wait until the storm has passed before leaving your safe place.

#### Outside

Find shelter

Lie down in a ditch or enclosed area. Cover your head with your hands. Stay away from trees and water. Do not stay in a car.
